**BOARD OF REGENTS
MEETING OF FEBRUARY 20, 2021**

Tom M. reminded everyone that recording of this meeting is not permitted.

1. A. A motion was made to approve the minutes from January 16, 2021, with an amendment to add the words “from a G.A. member” to the following:

The International Service Office received an anonymous donation *from a GA member* of \$240,000 to be used as a rainy-day fund to cover months when the I.S.O. has a shortfall month, like we had in December 2020. This money will allow the I.S.O. to pay some additional bills that have been held and not paid.

Tax donation letters were sent out by January 31, 2021. 258 letters were sent to Lifeliners and 18 letters to members who sent one-time donations greater than \$100. The total letters mailed were 276 tax donations. Tom M., Chair of Board of Regents, thanked the membership for the increased donations.

The I.S.O. received an anonymous donation, from a G.A. member, for \$25K this month, which will be shown in the February financial statements.

D. PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM (PPP).

As a reminder, the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) was a loan
provided to help small businesses keep their workforce employed
during Covid-19. Gamblers Anonymous, like other 12 step
programs, requested the loan with the understanding that it may be
eligible for loan forgiveness. At this time, the I.E.S. has completed
the paperwork needed to have the loan forgiven and submitted to
the bank. There have been a number of discussions with the bank
and the current status is in “review by the bank”.

3. NEW BUSINESS

- A. REVIEW B.O.R. BALLOT FOR JULY 1, 2021 – JUNE 30, 2023.
The B.O.R. ballot was reviewed by the current Board. One member’s abstinence date was incorrect and will be revised. The verbiage that will be sent with the ballot was modified to include a comment that the people who will be counting the votes are not on the ballot.

- B. REVIEW LITERATURE INVENTORY AND ORDER FORM.
This item was tabled to next month.

The collection in the amount of \$400 was taken and the meeting closed with the Serenity Prayer at 9:50 A.M. The next meeting of the Board of Regents will be held March 20, 2021 at 9:30 A.M.

TWELVE STEPS

In the January and February Bulletins I mentioned that Item #50 on the current order form “Gamblers Anonymous Writing The Steps” is a great piece of literature for working each of the 12 Steps of Recovery and that we would be making one of the exercises from each Step for the corresponding month available for your use right here in the Life-Line Bulletin. If you want to complete the other exercises, each booklet can be ordered from the I.S.O. for \$2.75 each plus shipping and handling.

STEP 3

Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of this Power of our own understanding.

Step 3, Exercise 1: Surrender

Step 3 asks us to surrender — to turn our will and our lives over **to the care of** our Higher Power. Notice that the step says **care of**, not control of. There's ease, gentleness, comfort and support in this kind of surrender. Step 3 asks us to make a commitment to let go of our stubborn, habitual or irrational need or desire to control things that are clearly beyond our control. These are “things we cannot change” — like the actions of others, the weather, the passage of time, and our compulsive gambling. By allowing our benevolent guiding spirit or Higher Power to handle these things, we free ourselves to address the things that are within our control. These are all the things we listed in Step 1, Exercise 4 — like remaining abstinent, attending meetings, being honest, finding spirituality, achieving balance. If we allow ourselves to be **cared for** in matters over which we have no control, we can direct our energies to effecting change within ourselves.

1) Write about three things you could lose — or you're afraid you could lose — if you were to make a decision to turn your will and your life over to the care of a Higher Power. Write about three things you could gain.

How do we become willing to open our minds and hearts to the benevolent guidance of a Higher Power? We can start within the program itself. Many of us in GA have come to experience the meetings and the fellowship as a power greater than ourselves. Through sponsorship, we can align ourselves with members who practice the principles of the program and embody its spirit.

2) Do you have a sponsor? If yes, write about how the relationship connects you to GA and supports you in your life. If no, list the qualities you would look for in a sponsor and write about how a nurturing relationship with someone in GA could enhance your recovery. Are you willing to make a commitment to choosing a sponsor within the next 60 days?

Temporary Guidelines for Video Meetings

- Protocol for entering and staying in video meetings using platforms such as Zoom, WebEx, etc. and video meetings in which members can attend either by video or telephone.
 - Attendance only by video
 - In order to enter the meeting, members should first be placed in a “waiting room” if the platform has this type of functionality. The purpose of the waiting room is to quickly determine the identity of the attendees and let them into the meeting either one at a time or en masse. When the waiting room feature is utilized, it is recommended that the meeting consider having at least two facilitators, one to monitor the waiting room and one to facilitate the meeting.
 - If the platform does not have this type of functionality, the meeting secretary or facilitator must assume the duty of identifying all attendees before the meeting begins as well as any attendee who arrives after the meeting has begun.

- Attendees who are not known to the waiting room facilitator should be further questioned as to the reason for their attendance. If they identify themselves as compulsive gamblers in need of a meeting or new members, they should be taken at their word and admitted to the meeting. The nature of the meeting (open or closed) will also determine the admission of those other than compulsive gamblers, and the final say on admission will rest with the waiting room facilitator.
- If anyone refuses to identify themselves to the waiting room facilitator, they should immediately be dropped from the waiting room.
- The meeting, through a group conscience, may elect to have all attendees turn their cameras off.
- If #5 above does not occur, attendees should still be given the option of turning off their cameras and appearing on screen as a “placeholder” or avatar.
- Attendees should caption their pictures, “placeholders”, or avatars with their first name and last initial only or any other caption that masks their true identity.
- Virtual backgrounds that may camouflage others who are sharing the member’s meeting space should not be used
- Attendance by telephone
 - Members who wish to attend a video meeting by telephone must be screened using the same methods as above so their identity is known to the waiting room facilitator and/or meeting facilitator.
 - Callers who refuse to identify themselves or whose caller ID is either blocked or shows “anonymous” shall not be allowed to attend.
- Announcements that should be read before each and every meeting (if not included in that meeting’s customary announcements)
 - There will be absolutely no video or audio recording of any kind, including screenshots.
 - Our meeting facilitators have done everything humanly possible to ensure that this is a secure meeting. However, because of the nature of the media we are working with, we cannot guarantee absolute security and thus, anonymity. Therefore, we ask that members not discuss...
 - Any crimes for which they may still be prosecuted
 - Anything of such a sensitive nature that it could potentially harm that member or any other members should that information be surreptitiously recorded and leaked.
 - Members who are especially concerned about their anonymity are invited to turn their cameras off and/or change their screen name.
