UNITY PROGRAM

Did you know that the I.S.O. sells a booklet on how to study the Unity Steps? We do! It's called "Gamblers Anonymous Group Study Book on the Unity Steps." Each month of 2022, I'll be listing the Unity Program corresponding step with each month. I'll be taking information from both this booklet and our red book, *A New Beginning*. Both of these are available on the Gamblers Anonymous website or order form.

As I entered my first meeting on July 30, 2001, at the Unity Club in Las Vegas, my brain was focused on one thing – to stop gambling. It's all I cared about for the first few months I was attending meetings. I had no idea what the Unity Program was or why it existed.

As my mind cleared up and I started to understand my surroundings, the Unity Program became less and less confusing for me. I'd like to think it's the same way for all of us, however, I can only speak of my experience.

It taught me that while I needed to focus on **MY** recovery, I also needed to respect the group as a whole and be one with them as we move forward on this journey of self-discovery and recovery.

Unity Step 7 – Every Gamblers Anonymous Group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

In order to maintain the independence of the Fellowship as a whole as well as individual groups, Gamblers Anonymous does not accept outside contributions. This policy is sustained in order that no undue control or influence can be exercised over Gamblers Anonymous, from without or within. By allowing outside contributions, both groups and members would be deprived of exercising responsibility over their affairs and their obligation to the Fellowship.

If anyone were to be permitted to contribute to Gamblers Anonymous other than its members, that person might expect the right to voice an opinion as to the manner that we choose to run our Fellowship.

a. Define/discuss: Gamblers Anonymous group, fully, self-supporting, declining, "outside contributions."

- b. I attend my home group weekly, and I give a dollar when I can. Sometimes I don't have the money. Can another member or the group secretary ask me to always donate or tell me how much? Discuss.
- c. Discuss and list what represents "outside contributions."
- d. When we were gambling, we threw away our money. When I first came into Gamblers Anonymous, they said I don't need to donate the first time if I don't have it. Now I feel like I do all I can to support all areas of Gamblers Anonymous such as my group, other groups, intergroup and the ISO to stay self-supporting by pitching in a dollar or two. Is this enough? Can Gamblers Anonymous stay self-supporting?
- e. When we were active in our addiction, most of us were dependent on others. How does this Unity Step 7 affect us personally and how does it affect my group, my area, and Gamblers Anonymous as a whole if we still are dependent on others when we are in recovery? Should we be fully self-supporting or continue to be dependent on others? How? Why?
- f. If we are at an open meeting or a birthday celebration and our family or Gam-Anon members wish to donate to our group, should this be allowed?
- g. What is a Life-Liner?
- h. The location where we are holding our meeting does not charge rent – it is free to 12-steps groups? Should we make a donation for the use of the room? Why or why not?
- i. Besides monetary, in what other matters do we practice being fully self-supporting in Gamblers Anonymous within our group, sponsorship, mini-conferences, workshops, etc.
- j. What service position do I hold? Am I doing enough? Am I doing too much?
- k. There are several principles that may apply to this step. Elaborate on how each of the following applies to Unity Step 7: gratitude, commitment, willingness, responsibility, self-supporting, independence.

AREA UPDATES FROM OUR MEMBERS

Dear I.S.O.,

I have been taught many things from my sponsor and the program over the past four years I have been in Gamblers Anonymous but one of the most important things I have learned is The Dash. The dash Larry and I discuss is not a race or contest. The dash we discuss is the dash of life. It is the dash on your tombstone, the days between your date of birth and date of death. What did you do with your dash? Today, that dash can be filled with anything and everything when I am in recovery.

Without GA in my life, my dash would be very different. The person I was in action versus the person I am today in recovery is day and night. I am so grateful to the people in this program for saving my life.

For the first 30 years of my life my dash would have been filled with anger and hurt. People would describe me as angry, vindictive, absent, not caring, a

terrible son, uncle, cousin, friend, boyfriend. My life would have been filled with a few happy memories but those that truly knew me would know there was an emptiness. There was almost something missing. Craig put a smile on his face and would try to make everyone else laugh to hide his pain. My dash would say he liked to gamble, play poker all night, watch sports, and ruin everything in his life. I would have left a trail of destruction that no one knew until my credit card statements, 401k statements, bank statements would come in the mail and phone calls would be received. My dash would say I died hopeless, scared, never willing to ask for help. My dash would be sad and short lived, a true reflection of myself as a compulsive gambler not in recovery.

Today, my dash would start, my name is Craig H, a compulsive gambler and my date of abstinence was June 22, 2018. My dash would say I died in recovery from my addiction and found a better way of life. My dash would say I was a loving husband, father, son, son-in-law, brother, uncle, cousin, and friend. My dash would say he loved his wife more than anything and she loved him too. My dash would say he was a great dad and his son loved him so much. My dash would say he was grateful for everyday and never took things for granted. My dash would say his children and his grandchildren were the loves of his life. My dash would say I loved to laugh at myself and make others laugh even more. My dash would say I loved to unabashedly bawl my eyes out. My dash would say he provided for his family and learned to do the right thing in life. My dash would say GA saved his life. My dash would say instead of ending his life early, he found a better way of life.
